Rammell House is a traditional boarding house founded in 1926 and is named after Old Cranbrookian A. W. Rammell Esq. The House colours were chosen as green and silver, the colour of Jesus College Oxford to which the first Housemaster of Rammell W. F. Griffin Esq. belonged.

The House stands proudly at the top of The Hill in Cranbrook town, a short distance from the main school campus opposite Rammell Field.
