Independent Study

- *Independent Study is a feature of all Year 11 homework timetables. Independent Study should be recorded in planners. Independent Study may be: the creation of revision notes, revisiting concepts or new vocabulary, accessing a variety of revision resources (such as GCSE Pod) and exercising more challenge through going beyond expected learning in and out of the classroom.*
- *Ask your class teacher if you are unsure of the areas you should be focusing on and where you can find the best resources.*

Note. As and when they become relevant next term, further opportunities in subjects will be publicised to students. Check with your class teacher about subject specific opportunities.

Daily Notices should also be checked for updates on wider support and intervention opportunities.
