## CRANBROOK SCHOOL MOBILE PHONE RULES



## Reasons:

- impact on the health of young people of excessive mobile phone usage
- lack of leadership shown by social media organisations in addressing this issue
- statement from Chief Medical Officers that unrestricted screen-time is damaging

## Rules -:

- Students in Years 7-11 must not use mobile phones or headphones/earphones between 08.20 and 15.35 hours, including in lessons unless this has been permitted by the class teacher. Sixth Form students may use mobile phones in the Sixth Form Centre only.
- If a parent believes it necessary for their child to carry a mobile phone to school, this must be kept securely hidden in a school bag or in an inside pocket and switched off. Any breach of this rule will lead to confiscation of the phone.
- If a teacher believes a mobile phone is necessary to capture lesson content from a whiteboard, they will use their own device before or after the lesson and circulate such content via school email. Teams or on the school Portal.
- Homework instructions must be noted down in the School Planner, not on a mobile phone.
- Sixth Formers may access revision material on mobile phones, but only in the Sixth Form Centre and not in classrooms.
- On the first occasion a mobile phone is confiscated, it will need to be collected by the pupil from Barham at the end of the school day.
- On the second occasion a mobile phone is confiscated, it will need to be collected by the parent from Barham at their convenience.
- Any further confiscation will lead to a requirement to hand the phone in at reception each morning and collect at the end of the day for at least a week.
- Mobile phones are entirely the responsibility of the pupil and his/her parent. If a
  mobile phone is lost, damaged or stolen, the school will consider the issue to be a
  very low priority.
- Mobile phones must not be used to contact parents in case of illness or upset a member of staff must always be the first means of communication. [In the case of an emergency, students can contact parents via Reception in Barham, and vice versa.]
- Mobile phones which are used for anti-social or criminal activities directed at fellow pupils, staff, parents, members of other schools or members of the public will be confiscated and if necessary handed to the police.
- This ban applies to all public spaces, boarding houses and classrooms during the school day.
