Students' Medication - A Reminder from the Medical Centre:

A reminder from the Medical Centre that students should not be carrying medication on them. Where possible, day students should take pain relief in the morning before attending school and attend the Medical Centre later in the day if subsequent doses are required. For students requiring longer term pain relief, please provide paracetamol or ibuprofen to the Medical Centre, where possible. Other prescribed medication should be handed into the Medical Centre. This must be in its original box, with the student's name and directions of use. The student will then need to attend the Medical Centre to receive their dose. Where possible please try and work doses outside of school hours.


Chicago - The Musical:

Year 11 Trip to Rome:




